THE PASTOR'S PAGE



This year during the period between Epiphany and Lent, we have seven Sundays.
Last year there were nine, next year there will only be five.
Sundays in this time period:

Epiphany -Jan 1, 2012 Baptism of the Lord- Jan 8th Sundays after Epiphany Jan 15th- Feb 12th Transfiguration Sunday Feb 19th Ash Wednesday - Feb 22nd The 1st Sunday in Lent is Feb 26th

Epiphany is now observed as a time of focusing on the mission of the church in reaching others by "showing" Jesus as the Savior of all people. It is also a time of focusing on Christian community and fellowship, especially in healing the divisions of prejudice and bigotry that we all too often create between God's children.

I am including some history about Epiphany. Let's prayerfully consider what Epiphany will reveal to us in this new year.

Significance of Epiphany in the Church:

As with most aspects of the Christian liturgical calendar, Epiphany has theological significance as a teaching tool in the church. The Wise Men or Magi who brought gifts to the child Jesus were the first Gentiles to acknowledge Jesus as "King" and so were the first to "show" or "reveal" Jesus to a wider world as the incarnate Christ. This act of worship by the Magi, which corresponded to Simeon's blessing that this child Jesus would be "a light for revelation to the Gentiles" (Luke 2:32),

was one of the first indications that Jesus came for all people, of all nations, of all races, and that the work of God in the world would not be limited to only a few.

From Dennis Bratcher:

The term epiphany means "to show" or "to make known" or even "to reveal." In Western churches, it remembers the coming of the wise men bringing gifts to visit the Christ child, who by so doing "reveal" Jesus to the world as Lord and King. In some Central and South American countries influenced by Catholic tradition, Three Kings' Day, or the night before, is the time for opening Christmas presents. In some eastern churches, Epiphany or the Theophany commemorates Jesus' baptism, with the visit of the Magi linked to Christmas. In some churches the day is celebrated as Christmas, with Epiphany/Theophany occurring on January 19th.

From Wikipedia:

The Time after Epiphany has anywhere from one to nine Sundays before Lent begins. The date of Easter varies from year to year, according to a lunar-calendar dating system (computus). Computus (Latin for "computation") is the calculation of the date of Easter in the Christian calendar. The name has been used for this procedure since the early Middle Ages, as it was one of the most important computations of the age. In principle, the date of Easter is defined as the Sunday following the Full Moon following vernal equinox (the so-called Paschal Full Moon). But neither the vernal equinox nor the full moon are determined by astronomical observation. Instead, a theoretical model known as the Ecclesiastical Full Moon is used, and the vernal equinox is taken to be set on 21 March. The model assumes that 19 tropical years have the same duration as 235 synodal months. The computus is thus the procedure of determining the first Sunday after the first ecclesiastical full moon that falls on or after 21 March.


