From Our Regional Newsletter.

WHERE DO REGIONAL DOLLARS COME FROM?

The Annual income for the Christian Church Capital Area comes from several very specific sources. The percentage varies depending on contribution levels, dividend earnings and participation in events and regional programming.

So these are approximations, but it gives a generalization about how much congregational giving to the Disciples Mission Fund and individual participation in the Christmas Offering and Annual Fund mean to the revenues of the region.

We understand the deficits in the economy of families and congregations over the last two years, but we hope that you will be as generous as possible as the year ends.

The Projected 2011 CCCA Budget currently is running just under a half million dollars. Below is the source of those funds. Those emboldened are direct congregational and individual gifts.

Disciples Mission Fund = 31% \$145,000 (50% of what is given comes to the Region. This is the Regional portion projection.)

Christmas Offering = 6.5% \$ 30,000 (100% of Christmas offering remains in the Region.)

Annual Fund = 4.5% \$ 21,000

Camps and Events = 15% \$ 69,300

Outside Rentals = 20% \$ 92,500 (Not all come from congregations or members)

Grants = 4% \$ 17,500 (Most are designated)

Dividends = 11.5% \$ 53,500 (Most are designated)

Field receipts = .5% \$ 2,000 (Funds given to Regional Minister for preaching, congregational visits, etc)

Foundation = 2% \$ 9,000

Other = 5% \$ 24,800

Total \$464,600

Financial Secretary's Report


After serving HCC as the Financial Secretary for the past twelve years, I think most everyone knows by now that I am stepping down from the position at the end of 2010. Beth Sweeney will be taking over in 2011, and she previously had already accepted the position of Chair of the Stewardship Committee. I will be providing my 2010 year-end report to the Church Board in February, and I will have individual Contribution Statements ready for everyone by mid-January. (From what I have heard, the IRS will be running a little behind this year due to late passage of tax law changes last week requiring them to modify some of the current tax forms. Consequently, refunds are expected to be arriving a little later than they usually do. On the bright side, that perhaps gives each of us a little more time to prepare those dreaded tax returns!)

As for HCC finances, 2010 was not as good a year as we would have liked. General Fund contributions fell about \$8,400 short of the 2010 budget. Thankfully, our operating expenses have been a little bit lower this past year, but we will probably have to use some church reserve funds to close out the year. The recently passed operating budget for 2011 remains essentially at the same level as 2010, so hopefully, with the overall economy recovering (albeit very slowly), the new year will bring an improvement to HCC's financial picture. The full 2010 report appears on a separate page in this newsletter.




