During a meeting with the Montgomery County Correctional Facility (MCCF), Warden Green indicated that they will be generously donating \$2,500 to offset camp expenses. We have also confirmed participation from Montgomery County Safe and Drug-Free schools who will provide the big yellow school bus to/from church and Camp Mary Mac, and Montgomery County Department of Recreation who will provide two vans to pick-up and drop-off the campers from their homes. Greenbrier State Park has also reserved our preferred gazebo (#3) for August 10-11 at a discounted rate (about 1/2 price).

I have spoken with the Yorks, the Bowers Family (Horses!), Chris Doherty (Spanish Teacher), and Cathy Matthews (Motivational Speaker) - who are all eager to join us and we are working on the schedule. Calls are also into Shorty (for the wagon ride). Mary Saxon-Clipper will also be joining us for the entire camp, along with Monica Talley and her sons Jourdan and Trevin.



Monetary donations are also needed and most welcomed.

On to San Antonio (my birth place) because Carolyn had never seen the River Walk so we stayed in a hotel right on it. The Alamo was framed in our 7th floor picture window. Three great meals with seating right at riverside. But the real plus was seeing Jerry and Nicole. Jerry was the Chaplain who married us and a dear friend. We met for breakfast at 9:30 a.m. and didn't leave the table until after two p.m. That tells you something. I found it hard to say goodbye and am looking forward to saying hello again. Next was the long trip across West Texas to Deming NM where we spent nearly a week with Carolyn's Dad. I am always amazed at his energy and good will for an 89 year old who is on constant oxygen and pain management. I hesitate to describe it until he gets a patent for it.

Next we went to Castle Rock, CO to spend some time with Dennis and Barbara. Dennis and I were in high school together almost 50 years ago and still enjoy talking about adventures then and we find that they are like family now. Although I was content to simply share time with them, they were gracious in showing us some of the new sights around Denver and hosting some glorious meals. Carolyn and Barbara were busy finishing a quilt while we did our thing. Next was the relatively short trip to Junction City, KS (my official

home town). I don't have family there anymore since my father's death six years ago, but still have dear friends living there. We always find time to stop by and see Helen. But I will admit, driving across West Texas at 80 mph, it dropped to 24.4. Still not bad.
