Around the Church:

I thought I would add this area as a way to update folks on a variety of items of interest, that you might not have heard of.

The Parsonage: Our tenants have signed a new two-year lease on the house beginning in August, 2022. They are very pleased with this rental.

Also note that the fuel oil tank for the parsonage was replaced in June—(we don't know how old it was, but was deteriorating).

The 'North-side' house has continued to be rented as a field office for Montgomery County construction projects. We expect that this rental will end soon. It has continued into 2022 on a month-to-month rental basis.

Our 'Food Pantry' continues to be utilized. Gail looks into it on a weekly basis, refilling from our supplies as needed. She reports that others are contributing to this pantry every week or so, not just us. Our local supplies are almost gone, (which was the intent), but where we go from here is yet to be decided.

The Church fuel-oil tank was also replaced this past week. As was the parsonage oil tank, deterioration was becoming evident. The annual inspections of our furnaces by Damascus Fuel keeps them in working order and alerts us to safety concerns.

Costs for the tank replacements were about \$2500 each— our building funds were able to pay for them. As always, contributions are welcome.

The Theatre Camp (directed by Gail) was held here from June 20th through July 2nd. Though a small selection of campers, the show went on with the final production on Friday night, July 1st. Thanks to all for their support of this effort.
